Arne Ruset (b. 1951) is from Fjøra, Sunnmøre. He currently lives in Molde, where he has worked as a psychiatrist for several years. Ruset works with different literary genres and has produced poetry, children's books, short stories and a novel. In 1987 he won the Norwegian literature critics children's literature award, and in 1999 he was given the Norwegian Ministry of Culture's award for illustrated literature (together with Anne Kristin Hagesaether). Ruset published a collection of short stories called Berg Brest at Solum Bokvennen in 2013 and his first



collection of poems was published in 2016 under the title Vi kan ikke eige kvarandre.
