The Snowman

The Snowman is the seventh novel featuring Harry Hole, and the first since Nesbø's debut novel *The Bat* to pit the ethylic Oslo detective against a true serial killer. The Snowman murders only when the first snow falls, choosing unfaithful wives as his victims and turning them into snowmen – literally. In addition to the Harry Hole series he is the author of stand-alone novels *Headhunters*, *The Son*, *Blood on Snow* and *Midnight Sun*, as well as several children's books in the Doctor Proctor's Fart Powder series.
