

Sanda Tomescu Baciu is professor at the Doctoral School of Language and Literary Studies of the Babeş-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. She graduated the Faculty of Letters of the Babeş-Bolyai University, English and French specialization (1978) and the Nordic Institute at the University of Oslo, with the title Candidata Philologiae (1980), holding a Ph.D. in Philology with a thesis about *the Northern Mythology and Its Echoes in Norwegian Literature* from the "Babeş-Bolyai" University (1999).

In 1991 she created and developed a BA-program of *Norwegian language and literature* in Romania at Babeş-Bolyai University (1991-2021), putting the foundation of the Chair (2001) and later on the Scandinavian Language and Literature Department (2011) where she formed a team of young teachers in the field of Norwegian language and literature. At the Faculty of Letters she was a member of the editorial board of *Studia Universitatis BabeşBolyai, Philologia*.

She has participated at international Nordic conferences in Norway, Italy, Great Britain, Austria, USA and has published and edited volumes and articles devoted to Nordic literature. She has been member of *The International Ibsen Society*, *The Ibsen Society of America*, and as an elected member of *The International Ibsen Committee* she participated in the organizing of the International Ibsen Conferences in New York (2003) and Oslo (2006).

Since 2010 she has been providing PhD-guidance in the domain of Norwegian literary studies - the drama of Henrik Ibsen, the reception of Nordic Literature into Romanian culture, translation and interculturality. She collaborates with Norwegian universities having conducted PhD-theses in co-tutelle.

She also translates classical and contemporary Scandinavian literature into Romanian from Norwegian, Swedish and Danish and she received the prestigious "Eta Boeriu" award for translation by the Union of Writers - Cluj Branch in 2005. She is also a member of the Writers' Union of Romania.

In 2003 Sanda Tomescu Baciu was awarded the Royal Norwegian Order of Merit, Knight, First Class.
